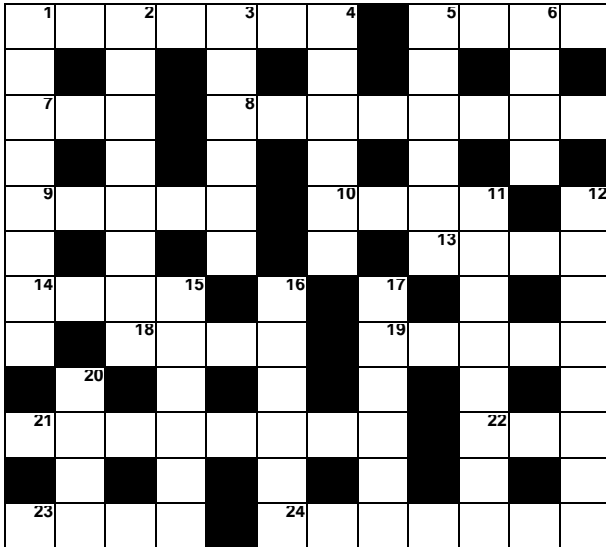

Parish Council News

At the April meeting Cllr. Collins reported that he had attended a meeting at Shotley Village Hall about the closure of the Chelmondiston Recycling Centre. After a very heated discussion Suffolk County Council agreed to look again at the proposed closure and possibly delay the closure date of May 9th. He had also attended a meeting with Cllr. Hurley at Capel St. Mary regarding the closing of the library there and said the village was looking at ways of running the library on a voluntary basis with financial help from the surrounding area. Councillors approved a planning application for Dodnash Fruit Farm in Bentley. Cllr. Plumbly said he had received a letter from Cllr. Adams who wished to resign from the Parish Council. Cllr. Wood reported that a new joint Chief Executive Charlie Aidan had been

appointed to run both Babergh and Mid Suffolk Councils. There is to be a closed meeting for District and Parish Councillors on 13th April re; the Buzabout service which is threatened with closure later in the year which he will attend with Cllr. Chambers. A letter had been received from Babergh District Council asking the village to take part in the village of the year competition which the Parish Council will take on. Cllr. Hurley and Cllr. Chambers offered to organise a litter clean up in the various parts of the village the date of which will be announced later. Parish and District Council elections take place on Thursday 5th May 2011.

In response to the letter from the playing field committee:

Unfortunately, in their letter in the April edition, the Playing Field Committee fails to see that, in their justification for spending money on the purchase of the abundance of signs instructing dog owners to clean up after their dogs, there is a central contradiction. The committee claims that the signs are necessary because of 'a minority that spoils things'. But logic then goes out of the window. If the signs are necessary for this spoiling minority, the signs obviously don't work (otherwise this presumed minority would not exist). So why do we have them? Beyond this central contradiction in their position is the clear exaggeration. How can dog fouling be described as 'a continuous nuisance'? 'Continuous' in what sense? Update on an Affordable Housing Scheme for Local People in Tattingstone

The Steering Group set up by the Parish Council and other stakeholders, continues to try and identify and secure a site for a development of affordable housing for the village of Tattingstone. Residents will recall that a Local Housing Need Survey was undertaken by the Rural Housing Enabler from Suffolk ACRE for Tattingstone Parish Council in September 2008. This survey demonstrated that there was a need for affordable housing for local people, and it was recommended that a scheme of 6-8 homes would be appropriate to meet the current and medium term affordable housing needs of the local community.


The site identification process has taken longer than expected, and so far has been unable to secure a suitable site. However the group is anxious to make further progress as they are very aware this type of accommodation is much needed in the village. Orwell Housing Association the registered provider partner for the scheme is contacting landowners of potential sites to establish which sites would be available to purchase. As explained before once we have secured a site, draft plans will be drawn up for the proposed scheme. This will involve the Housing Association's Architect entering into pre-application discussions with the Council's Development Control Team. We will then arrange a Public Information Day so that the site and the proposed scheme can be exhibited and discussed with the local community.

A planning application would then be made and funding would need to be secured. One advantage that Tattingstone has, is that Babergh District Council has agreed to use the proceeds from the sale of 30 and 31 Church Road to help to fund the provision of affordable housing in the village.

On Thursday 26th May the Monthly Benefice Coffee & Cake Morning that rotates around the parishes, will be held at my house from 10.30 – 12'noon. Once again everyone will be warmly welcomed whether you are a church goer or not. If you need directions please ring 328251.

The Archdeacon's Visitation Service this year will be held on the 18th May at St. Mary's Church, Hadleigh, at 7.30 pm. This service is where churchwardens are sworn-in by the Archdeacon for the following year. Anyone from the parish is warmly invited to the service. Both Linda Smalley and I agreed to continue as churchwardens for the next year and all voted in favour at the recent Annual Vestry and Parochial Church Meeting.

ON THE VEGGI PLOT FOR MAY...

Keep hoeing. Prepare runner bean supports and framework. Put straw around strawberry plants. Continue to monitor frost warnings. Don't forget to harden off plants before planting out. Mulch soil to retain moisture. Use newspapers, grass cuttings, leaf mould and straw to help water retention. Save kitchen waste for your compost. Collect jars. Beetroot seed benefits from being soaked in warm water overnight before sowing. Water after thinning to help resettle young plants and keep root disturbance to a minimum. Sow turnip seed where couch grass grows; it makes couch grass wilt and die.

SEASONAL VEG TO EAT THIS MONTH...

Asparagus, broad beans, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, leek, lettuce, peas, radish, spinach, spring onion, turnip greens. Bay, horseradish, lemon balm, mint, parsley.
